## Green County Sheriff's Office 2023 Annual Report

The Green County Sheriff's Office is the primary law enforcement agency in the County. Responsibilities include serving court and civil documents, arrest warrants, housing and transporting inmates, serving as bailiff to the Court and operation of the 911 Dispatch Center. Enforcement of traffic laws, responding to complaints from the public and investigation of criminal matters are other routine duties performed. The Office handled **12,457 total incidents**, compared to **12,676** in 2022. The Office traveled **632,627 total miles** during the course of their duties.

### By Division:

#### **Patrol:**

Patrol deputies attempted to serve **1,060** civil process papers, **8** sheriff's sales, issued **1,318** traffic warnings and **1,594** traffic citations. An **attached Incident Report** sheet lists the various types of cases that involve a patrol response.

Deputies responded to **770** traffic crashes in 2023. **7** people died in **(7)** traffic crashes in Green County in 2023. Deputies investigated **121** injury crashes and **643** property damage crashes, **280** of which were vehicle vs. deer collisions. Patrol deputies are most often the initial point of contact with the community in virtually any type of incident.

Deputies received approximately 48 hours of training each during the year to better prepare them for serving the citizens of Green County in a safe and efficient manner.

Our patrol division works two 12-hour shifts; 5:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m.-5:00 a.m. Minimum staffing requirements are at least three deputies per shift although when fully staffed, most shifts are staffed with four.

#### **Detectives:**

The detective division is staffed with three veteran officers that are specially trained to collect evidence, interview suspects and to conduct complex investigations. Typical incidents that require follow-up investigations by detectives include burglaries, thefts, sexual assaults, child abuse and neglect, assaults and death investigations. Analyzing technology, particularly the contents of smart phones has become a routine and the department has acquired tools to assist in extracting cell phone data. Each detective alternates weekends and holidays on call to provide on-going investigative availability.

## **Jail:**

The inmate population for 2023 averaged **42** inmates per day (Attached is a Daily Average Population Report). Advanced Correctional Healthcare continued to provide inmate health care for the year, including a contract for 8 hours per week of mental health counseling. Green County has contracted with Summit Foods to provide meals for the inmates.

During 2023, jail staff booked in **751** inmates after they were sentenced to jail terms by the court or arrested by law enforcement and incarcerated. Booking is a lengthy process that involves screening the inmate for medical issues, obtaining current address and physical information, taking photographs, fingerprints and DNA, recording current charges and accurately recording their jail sentence. Booking is often complicated by the inmate's behavior and level of intoxication. Prior to the booking process, the inmate is searched to ensure that no contraband is smuggled into the jail.

Approximately **7** inmates per day served their jail sentence on electronic monitoring. Inmates are considered for electronic monitoring based upon their conviction, sentence, adhering to a strict policy and ability to be adequately supervised. They pay for their own monitoring equipment and for the cost of the actual monitoring. Patrol deputies make unannounced checks on the inmates at their homes and work places to insure sobriety and that the inmate is following all jail rules

Fifteen jail deputies work a variety of shifts to maintain the security of the Green County Jail. Jail deputies complete cell checks, check in and out work release prisoners, deliver medications, book and release inmates, search cellblocks and a variety of other duties while documenting virtually every task that they complete.

## **Administrative Staff:**

The Chief Deputy and three Lieutenants oversee patrol, dispatch, detectives and jail staff. The administrative staff alternates on-call to allow staff to always be able to reach an administrator.

## **Dispatch:**

The eight full time dispatchers are responsible for answering and processing 911 calls for Emergency Service responders, including law enforcement, Fire, EMS, Coroner and other personnel. Our Dispatch Center is responsible for thousands of inquiries by phone, receive walk-in complaints and dispatch for our deputies and other law enforcement agencies in Green County. Dispatchers are required to complete multiple tasks simultaneously, work on sophisticated equipment and to be able to communicate with, reassure and to extract accurate information from hectic callers. Most of 2023, the Green County Sheriff's Office dispatched Fire, EMS and Police for the City of Brodhead during the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. daily, as that community discontinued dispatch staffing during those hours.

Utilizing grant funding, equipment began to be installed that upgraded the 911 system, allowed for a statewide communication link and to eventually implement Emergency Medical Dispatch. Two additional dispatch positions were added to the 2024 budget.

### **Business Manager/Clerical Staff:**

Our Business Manager manages the department budget, payroll, employee benefits and tracks department inventory. The Administrative Assistant fills open records request and a host of other clerical duties. Two full time Clerical staff dictate reports, ensure accuracy of records and file the thousands of cases which are created every year.

### **Maintenance:**

One full time maintenance worker along with one part time worker is responsible for the general maintenance of the Sheriff's Office buildings, outbuildings and property. The jail itself was completed in 1981 and remainder of the department building completed in 1959. The maintenance staff faces daily challenges in managing the aging infrastructure of our building.

### **Technology:**

The IT Manager manages all of the department's computers, technical infrastructure and fleet of vehicles, which are all in use 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The IT Manager also is the point person for the county's ongoing radio replacement project.

### **Justice Center Staff:**

One full time administrative sergeant staffs the Justice Center. The deputy is responsible for scheduling the court security staff, manning the weapons screening station and civil process. A number of former full-time law enforcement officers now work as part-time deputy sheriffs, providing security to the courts and transporting inmates from the jail to court as well as transporting inmates that have been incarcerated in locations other than Green County.

### **Special Assignments:**

Stateline Area Narcotics Team (SLANT): One full-time patrol deputy is assigned to SLANT, which comprises of law enforcement from Green County, Monroe PD, Lafayette County and multiple agencies in northern Illinois. Heroin and methamphetamine continue to be the most popular drugs of abuse but cocaine appears to be making a comeback and like always, marijuana use is prevalent.

Special Response Team (SRT): Commonly referred to as SWAT, the SRT is a group of highly trained deputy sheriffs and dispatchers that are skilled in responding to very high-risk incidents. In addition to making entry and apprehending armed individuals, some team

members are trained to negotiate with suspects, with a goal of all to come to a peaceful resolution to high risk situations. The Green County Sheriff's Office partners with Monroe PD and the Lafayette County Sheriff's Office to fill out a team that has highly trained individuals available at all times.

Honor Guard: Members of the Sheriff's Office participate in the Honor Guard, participating in law enforcement funerals and special events in Green County.

Administrative Sergeant: The administrative sergeant is assigned primarily to the Justice Center, in charge of scheduling court security deputies for all court proceedings. This position is also in charge of civil process and a variety of other tasks.

K-9 Team: K-9 Ali joined the Sheriff's Office in June of 2020 along with a new handler, Deputy Zachary Degner. Deputy Degner and his new partner attend 16 hours of training per month (per police K-9 standards) and are assigned to the night shift.

Heavy Truck Enforcement: Deputy Scott Ellefson, a specially trained deputy trained in MV Inspections specializing in heavy truck inspections, conducted 42 inspections. Many of the inspections revealed that the heavy trucks lacked adequate braking, had other mechanical issues or were significantly overweight, which leads to road damage or potential crashes. Night shift Deputy Scott Maresch also received specialized training and is joining in the inspection efforts.

Medication Collection: The Sheriff's Office collected hundreds of pounds of medications that were discarded in collection receptacles and drug take-back events in Green County in 2023.

Specialized Instructors: The majority of the Sheriff's Office training is conducted by deputies and dispatchers that are selected based on their outstanding job performance, seniority and skills. Those deputies and dispatchers are certified by the State of Wisconsin to present a variety of topics to our agency. These instructors provide the Sheriff's Office with the ability to hold training on-site, which has an added benefit of saving travel, meals, housing and overtime expenses for our staff rather than routinely having them travel to other parts of the state for the same training.

Staffing Challenges: Very much like the rest of our private sector employers and in the law enforcement profession in general, the Sheriff's Office has the same staffing challenges. In some cases, new employees decide that this work is not for them and select from a variety of employment opportunities for better hours and sometimes, better compensation. Some experienced employees have moved on to better compensation and benefits. Some retire. Filling those vacancies are extremely difficult as the competition for qualified law enforcement employees is fierce and their opportunities are abundant. The challenges are magnified on a daily basis as every village in Green County is unable to fill their shifts for the late night and early morning hours and the Sheriff's Office takes on the responsibility to police those villages with the same amount of personnel.
